It's known, due to climate change, raging wildfire in the southern Turkey have caused huge devastation, with many people losing their homes and possessions and some their lives.

Those fires also adversely affected the archaeological excavation sites in the region. (July-August 2021)





Disaster Preparedness Knowledge

DO NOT TAKE ANY RISK, SAFETY OF PEOPLE IS FIRST

1-As it is known, only the conflicting parties are present on the stage during armed conflicts. In an archaeological area threatened by forest fire, only primary actors are on the scene.

No help comes because the roads are closed. They have to do everything themselves with the means at their disposal.

In this case, they will first ensure their own safety and then take the necessary measures to protect and evacuate the archaeologic excavation site.


As a result, the vital lesson learned from our place-based case that every head of excavation and team should acquire basic knowledge of disaster preparedness and have basic needs to overcome the disaster.

Good Communication

2-One of the vital issues in disasters is to maintain uninterrupted communication during and after the disaster

As a result, it has been revealed that state actors of the secondary actors should take the necessary precautions in order not to interrupt the communication during the disaster.

Just in case, it is recommended to have a walky-talky at each archaeological excavation site.
